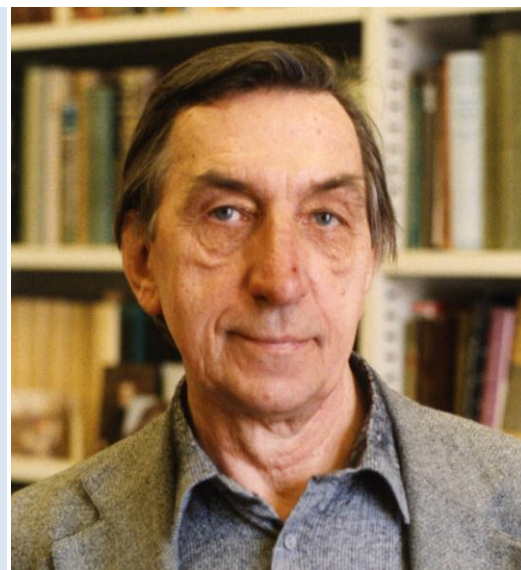

In honour of the outstanding work of the late Professor Jack Dainty, the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology has created an endowed scholarship to be awarded annually to a student in graduate research addressing interactions between organisms and their environment.

Jack Dainty was born in a coal mining region of Yorkshire in 1919. Despite growing up in poverty, he was able to obtain a scholarship to Cambridge University where he graduated with a doctorate in Physics in 1940. After work on the British nuclear effort during World War II, he developed a research interest in biology, and went on to become a highly influential pioneer in plant biophysics. Through his leadership, he established strong plant biophysics programs at the University of Edinburgh, the University of East Anglia, and the University of Toronto. He is particularly renowned for having introduced the thermodynamic approach to the study of ion and water transport in plants. In recognition of his achievements, he was named a fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, the Royal Society of Edinburgh, and an Associe Etranger L'Academie des Sciences de L'Institut de France. Jack passed away on May 29, 2009 at the age of 90.
